SCHOOL DISTRICT OF JEFFERSON BOARD OF EDUCATION POLICY

EDUCATION FOR EMPLOYMENT

The Board shall provide an education for employment program for elementary and secondary students which has been developed in accordance with state guidelines and has been approved by the appropriate state agency/official.

All students shall have access to an education for employment program that provides for the following:

- 1. Practical application of basic skills in the general and vocational curricula;
- 2. Community field experiences and, in grades seven through 12, school-supervised work experience;
- 3. Career exploration and planning which also addresses sex-role stereotyping in career decisionmaking;
- 4. Employability skills and attitudes;
- 5. Study of the practical application of economics and American economic institutions; and
- 6. In grades nine through 12, vocational education programs which have an appropriate curriculum based on labor market information including follow-up studies of graduates, job placement and employment needs.

The high school associate principal shall coordinate the education for employment program in accordance with state laws and regulations. Education for employment program records shall be maintained and reports shall be made as required.
