










## Presents:

#### **Youth Options**

Wisconsin's Youth Options program allows juniors and seniors who meet certain requirements to take post-secondary courses at a UW institution, a Wisconsin technical college or one of the state's participating private nonprofit institutions of higher education. Approved courses can count toward high school graduation, as well as for college credit. Under Youth Options a student will not have to pay for a college course if the school board determines the course qualifies for high school credit and is not comparable to a course already offered in the school district. If the course is approved by the school board, the student can receive one-quarter high school credit for every one college credit earned upon successful completion of the course. A student who successfully completes his or her high school graduation requirements will earn a high school diploma regardless of whether the requirements were met while attending the high school or a college. To obtain the necessary forms or to discuss the possibility of participating in the Youth Options program, contact the Jefferson High School Counseling office. Applica-

tions for enrollment in the Youth Options program must be made by October 1st for the spring semester.

# **ACT Engage**

#### **ACT ENGAGE for Freshmen**

ACT Engage® is a 30 minute online assessment designed to measure behaviors and student attributes that often go unassessed in regards to school success. ACT has designed this tool to help educators focus on areas of concern in an effort to increase college and career readiness skills in all students.

ACT Engage provides important information about a student's motivation, social engagement, and self-regulation. It will also help to:

- **Identify** students with personal challenges that go unreported in standardized academic tests
- **Improve** graduation rates and directly reach students whose personal challenges may hinder academic success
- Evaluate a student's self-reported psychosocial attributes
- **Define** a student's levels of academic risk
- Use suggested interventions to help students improve academic achievement

Jefferson High School plans to use the ACT Engage assessment in conjunction with the Wisconsin Developmental School Counseling Model for freshmen transition and individual conferencing. Results of the assessment will not only allow for school-wide recommendations, but also for individual interventions, if necessary.

All freshmen will be taking the ACT Engage on October 16, 2017 during their homeroom. If parents do not want their student to participate, they are asked to contact JHS Principal, Steve Dinkel at dinkels@sdoj.org to opt out.



#### To All Prospective 2018 Jefferson High School Graduation Participants

Welcome to your final year with the School District of Jefferson! It is our hope that you have received an invaluable education which prepares you to achieve your dreams. At the end of this school year, the community and your fami-

lies come together to celebrate your achievements through high school graduation. While this may seem to be in the distant future, your senior year slips by quicker than all of the others and so we need to begin preparing now.

Any eligible student participating in Jefferson High School graduation must have an appropriate cap and gown. The class officers have selected the traditional maroon for boys and white for girls. In addition to caps and gowns, some students may also wish to order announcements, invitations, and assorted senior material. For that reason, our Jostens representative, Chad Kilton, will be meeting with you during IE time (2:30 p.m. to 3:05 p.m.) on Thursday November 2, 2017. He will go over the process for ordering these materials, as well as how to fit graduation gowns, and you will be providing him with your name information for the diplomas themselves. All prospective graduates, including alternative education, co-op, and flex time students, are to be in attendance for this meeting to ensure proper ordering.

Orders will be collected in the high school commons during the lunch periods on November 9. Any student who needs to order and is unable to order at this time should drop off his or her order in the office prior to November 9th. A down payment is expected with the order and full payment must be made before graduation material will be dispersed (usually at the end of March).

# **GOOGLE EXPEDITIONS**

#### Google Expeditions being used in Biology classes at JHS

During the week of September 18-22, students in Ms. Hooker and Mr. Gotto's Biology classes were taken on a virtual field trip to see and learn about prehistoric Earth. The Biology teachers teamed up with Mr. Kevin Schmitz, the district's new Library Media Specialist to bring Google Expeditions into the classroom. Mr. Schmitz has a strong background using the Google Expedition program and is encouraging teachers from all departments to bring this innovative piece of technology into their curriculum. The district has purchased 1 classroom kit, which includes 30 cell phones, 30 virtual reality viewers, a teacher pad, and 1 Wi-Fi router. Setup is simple and there are currently over 500 destinations from which teachers can choose.


In the Biology classes, teachers choose "Earth's Timeline" which is a 7 module Google Expedition that provides a 360 degree view of each of the major era's Earth has experienced. Within each module the teacher guides students through various learning points. Teachers can direct the students to turn and look at various items. There are also scripted lessons and questions that the teacher can use within each module.

The Google Expeditions provides students with content and views that are often hard to describe within the normal classroom setting. The students were impressed with the program and are looking forward to the next time they get to go on a virtual field trip.












# Yearbook

Commonly asked questions about our YEARBOOK



Deadline for submission of senior portraits is December 1st. Preferably, we would like you or your photographer to submit a photo electronically. Please e-mail to cruciusc@sdoj.org or copy onto a CD. To submit a photo manually, please send a wallet-size photo to Mrs. Crucius in room 146 at the high school. Please note that the photo

will not be returned. Please follow the dress code guidelines set within the student hand-book. JHS Yearbook reserves the right to refuse submission of photos.

Why aren't yearbooks delivered in the Spring?

If yearbooks arrived in Spring, the yearbook staff would have to complete the yearbook pages by March. Our publisher needs time to process, print, and deliver the books by May. These deadlines mean that any event after March, including Prom, all spring sports, and graduation, would be included in the NEXT year's book. Therefore, your child's senior year would be spread over 2 yearbooks. In order to cause less confusion, the decision has been made to deliver the books in Fall, encompassing students' entire year into 1 yearbook.

Where can I pick up my yearbook?

If you were unable to attend the SDoJ's Open House in August, we still have your yearbook. If you want it before school starts, stop by the office, where the books are currently located. Any senior who has graduated can pick up his/her yearbook at the office, too. Once school starts, Mrs. Crucius will have your book in room 146. Please stop by to get it!

How can I order a yearbook?

The yearbook staff uses exclusive online ordering system. For online shopping, log on at http://www.jostens.com/ and find the products at Jefferson High School. There, you can purchase the yearbook, autograph pages, and personalize your book. This is another receipt for you to have for proof of purchase. We periodically send out postcards as reminders. If you've received a postcard, we have not entered your sales into our database yet.


