

ADMISSION OF NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS OTHER THAN OPEN ENROLLMENT STUDENTS

Applications from nonresident students to attend Jefferson Public Schools shall be considered when space is available. The district may deny the enrollment of a student during his/her term of expulsion from another district.

Nonresident students attending district schools shall be charged tuition in accordance with state law. Exceptions to this policy are as follows:

1. The Board shall permit a student who is enrolled in a district school and is a resident of the district at the beginning of the school year to complete the school year at the school without payment of tuition, even though the student is no longer a resident of the district.
2. The Board, upon request of a student's parent/guardian, shall permit a student who has gained 12th grade status in the high school and is a resident of the district at the time of gaining such status to complete the 12th grade at the high school without payment of tuition, even though the student is no longer a resident of the district.
3. The Board may waive tuition in order to bring into the district on occasion students from other countries or other areas of the United States, under exchange programs which have been recognized by the Board.

All requirements regarding health examinations and immunizations which apply to resident students shall also apply to nonresident students who enroll in the Jefferson Public Schools.
