

## STUDENT IMMUNIZATIONS

All students entering the School District of Jefferson schools at any grade level must be immunized against diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, polio, measles, rubella, mumps, Hepatitis B, Chicken Pox, and any other disease in accordance with Wisconsin state immunization laws. These requirements can be waived only if a properly signed health, religious or personal conviction exemption is filed with the school.

All students entering School District of Jefferson schools shall be screened to determine if the student has been properly immunized. Students not in compliance shall be notified in accordance with state health department regulations.

Students who have not been properly immunized according to state law shall be excluded by the Superintendent from school attendance as required by law. Grade K-12 noncompliance students and students without an immunization record will be excluded from school on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of school in accordance with Wisconsin Immunization Law (HFS 144, Wisconsin Statutes Ch. 252).

In cooperation with public health agencies and officials, the Board shall develop and implement a plan to encourage compliance with state student immunization requirements. The plan shall be submitted to the appropriate state agency as required by law.
