

FUNDRAISING/SALES ON SCHOOL PREMISES

The Board recognizes that the prime purpose of the schools is to educate students. Class schedules are filled to the maximum at all times and further fragmentation is not desirable. Although almost every "cause" that is geared to raising money or increasing attendance at activities is a worthy one, it is not possible to approve all requests from non-school-related organizations to make presentations to students. Therefore, the Board prohibits the sale of tickets and other fundraising activities by non-school-related individuals or organizations to students while they are under school auspices and presentations of non-school-related efforts by non-school-related individuals or organizations, whether for fundraising or any other non-school-related purpose, on school premises. The underlying reasons for this policy are:

1. Such activities disrupt classes and student's schedules.
2. Students who cannot afford to pay to attend functions feel diminished in their eyes, and they believe, in the eyes of their peers.
3. Conducting sales require the time of personnel who are paid by the district to do only work associated with the school.
4. Such activities take time away from the learning experience.

No non-school-related individual or organization may sell goods or services on school premises without prior permission of the Superintendent.
