



# NOTICE OF GENERAL ELECTION, REFERENDUM AND SAMPLE BALLOTS NOVEMBER 8, 2022

## TO THE VOTERS OF JEFFERSON COUNTY

Notice is hereby given of a general election to be held in the several wards in Jefferson County, on November 08, 2022, at which the officers named below shall be chosen. The names of the candidates for each office to be voted for, whose nominations have been certified to or filed in this office, are listed under the title of the office and under the appropriate party or other designation, together with any referendum questions submitted to a vote, in the sample ballot below.

### INFORMATION TO VOTERS

Upon entering the polling place and before being permitted to vote, a voter shall:

- state their name and address
- show an acceptable form of photo identification\*
- sign the poll book\*\*

**\*If a voter does not have acceptable photo identification, the voter may obtain a free photo ID for voting from the Division of Motor Vehicles.**

**\*\*If the voter is unable to sign the poll book due to disability, a poll worker may write the word "exempt."**

If a voter is not registered to vote, they may register to vote at the polling place serving their residence if the voter provides proof of residence.

Where ballots are distributed to voters, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the ballot.

Upon being permitted to vote, the voter shall enter a voting booth or go to a machine and cast their ballot. The vote should not be cast in any manner other than specified here. Sample ballots or other materials to assist the voter in marking their ballot may be taken into the booth and copied. The sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone so as to reveal how the ballot is marked.

A voter who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the voter's minor child or minor ward.

An election official may inform the voter of the proper manner for casting a vote, but the official may not advise or indicate a particular voting choice.

### Assistance for Voting

A voter may select an individual to assist in casting their vote if the voter declares to the presiding official that they are unable to read, have difficulty reading, writing, or understanding English, or that due to disability are unable to cast their ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the voter's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the voter. If a voter is unable to state their name and address, an assistant may also do so for the voter.

### Where Optical Scan Voting is Used

The voter shall fill in the oval next to the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which they intend to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall write in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided for a write-in vote and fill in the oval next to the write-in line. On referendum questions, the voter shall fill in the oval next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall fill in the oval next to "no" if opposed to the question.

When using an *electronic ballot marking device*, Express Vote, to mark an **optical scan** ballot, the voter shall touch the screen or use the tactile pad to select the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which they intend to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall touch the screen next to "write-in" and type in the name of the person of their choice. On referendum questions, the voter shall touch the screen at "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall touch the screen at "no" if opposed to the question.

### Spoiled Ballots

If a voter spoils an **optical scan** ballot, they shall return it to an election official who shall issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one voter. If the ballot has not been initialed by two inspectors or is defective in any other way, the voter shall return it to the election official who shall issue a proper ballot in its place.

The voter may spoil a **touch screen** ballot at the voting station before the ballot is cast.

### After Voting the Ballot

After an official optical scan ballot is marked, it may be inserted in a security sleeve so the marks do not show. The voter shall then insert the ballot in the voting device or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. The voter shall leave the polling place promptly.

## Referendum Explanatory Statements and Effect of Votes

### School District of Fort Atkinson

TAKE NOTICE that a referendum election shall be held on November 8, 2022 in the School District of Fort Atkinson for the purpose of approving or rejecting a Revenue Cap Resolution and an Initial Resolution adopted by the School Board of said District on August 18, 2022.

The Revenue Cap Resolution reads as follows:

#### RESOLUTION TO EXCEED REVENUE CAP COMMENCING WITH THE 2022-23 SCHOOL YEAR

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of the School District of Fort Atkinson, Jefferson and Rock Counties, Wisconsin, that the final school district budget beginning with the 2022-23 school year shall include an amount not to exceed \$3,000,000 each year (on a recurring basis) and the following not to exceed amounts (on a non-recurring basis for a period of three years): \$4,000,000 in the 2023-24 school year, \$4,000,000 in the 2024-25 school year and \$5,000,000 in the 2025-26 school year all in excess of the revenue limits imposed by Section 121.91 of the Wisconsin Statutes for the purpose of paying District operating costs in support of cultivating an inclusive high-performing culture of growth and community.

The referendum ballot will ask District electors: "Shall the School Board of the School District of Fort Atkinson be authorized to exceed the revenue limit under Section 121.91 of the Wisconsin Statutes on a recurring basis beginning with the 2022-23 school year by an amount not to exceed \$3,000,000 each year and on a non-recurring basis for a period of three years by the following not to exceed amounts: \$4,000,000 in the 2023-24 school year, \$4,000,000 in the 2024-25 school year and \$5,000,000 in the 2025-26 school year for the purpose of paying District operating costs in support of cultivating an inclusive high-performing culture of growth and community as provided in the foregoing resolution?"

A "yes" vote is in favor of the resolution set forth above and is a vote to approve exceeding the revenue limit under Section 121.91 of the Wisconsin Statutes on a recurring basis beginning with the 2022-23 school year by an amount not to exceed \$3,000,000 each year and on a non-recurring basis for a period of three years by the following not to exceed amounts: \$4,000,000 in the 2023-24 school year, \$4,000,000 in the 2024-25 school year and \$5,000,000 in the 2025-26 school year for the purpose of paying District operating costs in support of cultivating an inclusive high-performing culture of growth and community.

A "no" vote is opposed to the resolution and is a vote to deny exceeding the revenue limit under Section 121.91 of the Wisconsin Statutes on a recurring basis beginning with the 2022-23 school year by an amount not to exceed \$3,000,000 each year and on a non-recurring basis for a period of three years by the following not to exceed amounts: \$4,000,000 in the 2023-24 school year, \$4,000,000 in the 2024-25 school year and \$5,000,000 in the 2025-26 school year for the purpose of paying District operating costs in support of cultivating an inclusive high-performing culture of growth and community.

The Initial Resolution reads as follows:

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of the School District of Fort Atkinson, Jefferson and Rock Counties, Wisconsin, that there shall be issued, pursuant to Chapter 67, Wisconsin

Statutes, General Obligation Bonds in an amount not to exceed \$22,000,000 for the purpose of paying the costs of secure entry sequence improvements, maintenance and mechanical projects at all buildings and traffic flow improvements at the high school.

The referendum ballot will ask District electors: "Shall the foregoing resolution of the School Board of the School District of Fort Atkinson be approved?"

A "yes" vote is in favor of the Initial Resolution set forth above and is a vote to approve the borrowing of not to exceed \$22,000,000 by the School District of Fort Atkinson through the issuance of General Obligation Bonds for the purpose of paying the costs of secure entry sequence improvements, maintenance and mechanical projects at all buildings and traffic flow improvements at the high school.

A "no" vote is opposed to the Initial Resolution and is a vote to deny the School District of Fort Atkinson the authority to borrow not to exceed \$22,000,000 through the issuance of General Obligation Bonds for the purpose of paying the costs of secure entry sequence improvements, maintenance and mechanical projects at all buildings and traffic flow improvements at the high school.

### School District of Jefferson

The referendum election ballot will ask District electors to vote "yes" or "no" on the referendum election questions as set forth above.

A "yes" vote on Question Number I is a vote to approve the borrowing of \$34,000,000 by the School District of Jefferson through the issuance of general obligation bonds for the purpose of paying the cost of a school facility improvement project consisting of: district-wide safety, security, building systems, infrastructure and site improvements; renovations at East, West and Sullivan Elementary Schools; construction of an addition and renovations at the High School; and acquisition of furnishings, fixtures and equipment.

A "no" vote on Question Number I is a vote to deny the School District of Jefferson the authority to borrow \$34,000,000 through the issuance of general obligation bonds for the purpose of paying the cost of a school facility improvement project consisting of: district-wide safety, security, building systems, infrastructure and site improvements; renovations at East, West and

Sullivan Elementary Schools; construction of an addition and renovations at the High School; and acquisition of furnishings, fixtures and equipment.

In the event a majority of the electors voting on Question Number I vote "yes", the District will be authorized to undertake the school facility improvement program described in

Question Number I and borrow not in excess of \$34,000,000 therefor; if a majority vote "no" on Question Number I set forth above, the District will not be so authorized.

A "yes" vote on Question Number II is a vote to approve the borrowing of \$8,000,000 by the School District of Jefferson through the issuance of general obligation bonds for the purpose of paying the cost of the construction and equipping of an athletic complex and related facilities on district-owned land, including site improvements.

A "no" vote on Question Number II is a vote to deny the School District of Jefferson the authority to borrow \$8,000,000 through the issuance of general obligation bonds for the purpose of paying the cost of the construction and equipping of an athletic complex and related facilities on district-owned land, including site improvements.

In the event a majority of the electors voting on Question Number II vote "yes", the District will be authorized to undertake the school building and facility improvement program described in Question Number II and borrow not in excess of \$8,000,000 therefor; if a majority vote "no" on Question Number II set forth above, the District will not be so authorized.

### School District of Lake Mills

The referendum election ballot will ask District electors to vote "yes" or "no" on the referendum election questions as set forth above.

A "yes" vote on Question Number I is a vote to approve the borrowing of \$44,000,000 by the Lake Mills Area School District through the issuance of general obligation bonds for the purpose of paying the cost of a school building and facility improvement project consisting of: constructing and equipping a new intermediate school on district-owned land, including site improvements; and minor district-wide improvements.

A "no" vote on Question Number I is
